Wise Men still Seek Him


Blessed Epiphany to each and every one of you! In this season, we rejoice that God came in the flesh, not only to fulfill the law and the prophets for the Jews, but that He has come to be the Savior of all the nations!

In Matthew 2, the Gospel text for the Epiphany, we read, *“Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, “Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we saw His star when it rose and have come to worship him.”... And going into the house, they saw the Child with Mary His mother, and they fell down and worshiped Him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered Him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh.” (Matt 2: 1-3, 11)*

Magi, or ‘wise men’ from the east, came to bow down and worship the toddler King, Jesus. Their gifts were costly for sure- gold, frankincense and myrrh- but the gift that the young King had to offer was priceless. Through the shedding of His blood, the gift of forgiveness of sins for all nations would be purchased. With His innocent suffering and death, He would pay the debt of all. With His resurrection from the dead, His meal of remembrance became for us a re-remembering (a reuniting) with His very living body and blood. With His ascension into heaven and the sending of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, all nations are now hearing the Good News of Christ, the Servant King.

“Wise Men” of all ages and all nations need the gifts that Christ the King gives—and they seek Him where He may be found. For now the King comes to us in Word and Sacrament to bestow His gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation—and He has promised to do so until the end of this age (Matt 28:20). It is also true that “wise men” (that’s all of you, dear brothers and sisters in Christ) seek to share His gifts with those among us—our family, friends, co-workers, community members—and extend them to all nations.

So during this Epiphany season, I encourage you first to **continue to seek Christ** where He has promised to be present. Second, I encourage you that as you have been given His gifts, you would be **active in sharing** them with others. Finally, I encourage you to **participate in the Congregational Summit** on Saturday, January 26 as we seek the Lord’s guidance and direction for our congregation in 2019 and beyond.



Mission Moment

One of the LWML Mission Grants that was awarded at the 2017 Convention in Albuquerque was to provide \$25,000 to give nursing students in the Concordia University system the opportunity to participate in a short-term mission trip to Madagascar with a Mercy Medical Team. This service opportunity for students to work with medical professionals in providing medical and/or spiritual care to the under-served would be invaluable. This grant has yet to be disbursed because enough mite money has not yet been received. As of the end of October, almost \$1.4 million has been received in Mite Offerings. The goal for the 2017-2019 Biennium (which ends March 31, 2019) is \$2,075,000.

Catechism Corner



The celebration of Epiphany focuses on the narrative of the Magi from the east who sought out Jesus. For all the tradition surrounding them, there is much we do not know about the magi: where in "the east" exactly were they from (popular theories include Greece, Anatolia, and Persia)? How many of them were there (three gifts doesn't necessarily mean three magi)? Were they Jew or Gentile? (Modern tradition holds them to be Gentile but, after the exile, Jews settled in many different eastern nations and, as we see in Daniel, often held positions of authority where they lived.)

These are all intriguing and relevant thoughts from an academic perspective, but the biblical narrative doesn't address any of these questions directly for one very important reason: they do not matter. In the face of the greater meaning of the Epiphany story, it really isn't important what ethnicity or nation the wise men came out of. The miraculous nature of the story is that these men, so far removed from the physical event of Jesus' birth, recognized the sign in the sky, trusted in the Scriptures and worshipped Him as their Lord. None of this would have happened had it not been for the unpleasant period of Israel's history known as the Babylonian Exile. Though their temple was sacked, their lives uprooted and their land taken from them, still God was at work through His chosen people to make His name known in places it had never been heard before. Through the witness of the Jews in foreign lands, many people beyond Israel's borders came to the knowledge of the Scriptures and faith in Yahweh; the Magi, whether they be Jew or Gentile, are living proof of this. God works His good in every situation.

The Magi, though somewhat enigmatic figures, represent some important aspects for the Christian understanding of God. First, that He is God of Jew and Gentile, regardless of nationality or geographic location. Second, that His plan of Salvation is not reliant on the desires or obedience of His people (Herod, a Jew, rejected this plan, after-all). And finally, that He is able to work faith in all circumstances, no matter how hopeless they might seem by worldly reckoning. There were a tremendous amount of moving pieces in the grand puzzle that brought the Magi to their knees before their Lord and Savior, but God, the author of History and Master over all kings and kingdoms saw fit to include these men of faith in the story of the Christ that we might share in the same hope that they had—that the revealing of Jesus Christ is good news for all peoples.

MY BROTHER'S CLOSET






**Weather-related
