SINGING WITH THE EXILES

Gathered by the waters of Babylon, Judean exiles wistfully wondered: Is God for real? If so, does He really care about us? What does our future hold? Will this ever change? God's people had watched their world shatter into a million pieces. They were demoralized and disillusioned. Their disaster looked terminal.



Do you feel this way? Does it look as though your current problems are more than you can bear? Do you find yourself asking: Why did this happen? Why did God allow it? Is there any order in the world? Will God really deliver on what He said?

Isaiah answers these questions in chapters 40–55 of his book. He announces that just when Israel's history seemed closed and controlled by hopeless Babylonian imperial policy, to the shock and surprise of everyone the Lord will stir up a king named Cyrus and a new exodus will explode in the desert! A Servant will be wounded for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities. And barren Zion will be given so many children that, like the old woman in the shoe, she won't know what to do! Standing behind these marvelous promises is God's almighty Word. "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever" (Is. 40:8). The exiles are going home!

That's why we are "Singing with the Exiles" as they are restored to their home.

This Lent, Isaiah 40–55 will shape us as we . . .

Meditate upon daily devotions based upon these chapters; (available in the narthex)

Easter Vigil—**April 11** "Nothing" (Isaiah 54:1–8) Celebrated at **University Lutheran, 8pm**

Easter Sunday—**April 12** "We Are Going Home" (Isaiah 55:6–13)

Plan now to *sing with the exiles* as we learn from Isaiah to walk the Lenten way to the cross and to the empty tomb. God promises to turn our weeping into joy and our present pain into an endless **ALLELUIA!**



Mites—Mission Grant #7 \$100,000 for Camp Restore Detroit Restoring Hope for Detroit Children and Families



Your **mites** help support LWML grants at district, national, and international levels. Featured this month--in the amount of \$100,000--is **Camp Restore Detroit.**

Camp Restore New Orleans has been a beacon in the city of New Orleans for many years, providing hope, restoration, and care to the people affected by hurricane Katrina. The devastation caused by that hurricane is very similar to what is seen when driving through some of the streets of Detroit today — an economic disaster — with ruins similar to that of New Orleans; Detroit residents call it “a hurricane without water.” Families live in areas where adjacent yards, sidewalks, and building foundations sometimes can’t be seen due to the overgrowth of weeds and debris. With low population numbers and declining real estate values, it is difficult for the city to provide services that many of us take for granted.

Camp Restore Detroit (CRD) was created as a ministry of Mt. Calvary Lutheran Church, an LCMS church located in the middle of the disaster-ridden Ninth Precinct. In May 2017, the first “campers” (volunteers) began arriving. They partnered with local community leaders to restore hope to this area, while being fed and housed at Mt. Calvary. The volunteers have cleared hundreds of lots, boarded up countless houses, and served at nursing homes, food banks, and sport centers as they worked with local leaders. God has worked powerfully through these people, establishing an uplifting, cooperative relationship among *Camp Restore* personnel, Mt. Calvary members, and people in the community.



With the encouragement of the city of Detroit, CRD purchased, at a minimal cost, lots adjacent to the church which included two abandoned houses, including this one, lovingly called 'The White House' by the volunteers. Much work has gone into the property already, as the lot had to be cleared, trash had to be taken out of the house, and the inside gutted. It is now boarded up and waiting for the next step.

Through this mission grant, CRD will be able to renovate these houses into Christ-centered community outreach centers and community gardens, where lives of children and families can be changed.

The CRD playground, which was built on lots where three abandoned houses stood a few years before, is already a great place to gather. With the addition of these two houses, CRD will be able to create programs for children, adults and families to enjoy hearing the Gospel in a safe setting, while engaging in personal growth activities that bring joy, creativity, education, and hope back into their lives.

Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward” (Psalm 127:3).


