



Endowment Requests due February 28

Faith's Parish Planning Council (PPC) is pleased to announce that \$30,000 has been identified as income from Faith's Endowment Fund that can be used by ministry teams and other congregational entities in 2021 **to support new ministry opportunities** outside of Faith's regular operating budget.

To request a use for this funding **download an application form from the church website**; completed forms must be submitted to the church office no later than Sunday, February 28.

Five years ago, Faith Lutheran Church established this endowment fund from special gifts of members and friends of the congregation. It is a separate fund from the weekly contributions that support the regular budgetary needs of the church. The Endowment Fund is intended to enhance the mission of Faith Lutheran Church by enabling the congregation to expand and continue a vision of stewardship and support for responding to important needs and new ministry opportunities.

Clarity

Faith's Constitution calls for an **annual gathering of all members** during the first quarter of each year. We call it our "Congregational Summit." Each year a theme is selected to help us focus on the ministry that we share here at Faith. In January 2020, over 50 members participated in "Every One His Witness." About 45 members met via Zoom on February 6, 2021, with theme of "Clarity," building on the new Guiding Statement for our congregation:

***Proclaiming and Practicing God's Love
with Conviction and Courage***

...in our households, congregation and beyond.

A small team* has been meeting with Pastor Tom Eggebrecht of the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF), who facilitates a Ministry Planning program called "Clarity." The team has reviewed over 50 ministry activities at Faith and grouped them under one or more of five "Ministry Pillars":

- Worship
- Education
- Fellowship
- Evangelism
- Service

The team developed twelve questions, two to three under each Pillar, for conversation among our members. During the one-hour Summit participants were divided into five sub-groups. Each sub-group, with a pre-assigned facilitator, discussed the questions related to just one of the pillars, documenting their answers. These will then give focus to new or revised goals as we seek "Clarity" for our ministry together during the next 3-5 years.


Camp is happening this summer

“Return to the Lord” this Lent

- We look forward to worshipping with you **in person!** (see below for upcoming schedule)

- Spend a few minutes a day in personal and family devotions. **Printed resources for adults and children** are available under the lower canopy at church.
- Use a **Lenten coin folder** for small daily offerings (also available under the canopy)
- reate an **ALLELUIA** to be part of this year’s Easter ALLELUIA banner. (see below)



Ash Wednesday (February 17)
Drive-in worship:
Noon & 7pm
with Holy Communion

The imposition of ashes will be available beginning a half hour before each service, as you arrive. Pastor Edwards (who will be fully vaccinated) will mask up and impose the ashes. Also, *instead of using olive oil to mix the ashes, hand sanitizer will be used.* You will experience a slight tingling sensation due to the alcohol.

To receive ashes:

- As you arrive in the parking lot, pull under the upper vestibule as you would for receiving the Lord’s Supper, but **in the reverse direction** (driver’s side facing the building).
- Please keep your mask on as you receive the ashes.
- You may then park in preparation for worship.

(Communion procedures at the end of the service will be in the normal driving direction.)

ALLELUIA



Lent, beginning on Ash Wednesday is a time of repentance, when we think especially about our sins and the suffering death of Jesus. So we set aside the singing and saying of “ALLELUIA!” as an added reminder of the seriousness of our sin. On Easter Sunday we celebrate Christ’s resurrection and our redemption, and again have something to cheer about. Christ is alive! He has risen! We are redeemed! “ALLELUIA!”

Jesus Company, one of our Faith children’s ministries, has always had a tradition of each child designing his own personalized “ALLELUIA!” just before Lent. These are put away in preparation for the start of Lent in a symbolic way for us to reflect on our sins and need for a Savior. With COVID pausing Jesus Company, we decided to expand the tradition. ALL God’s “children” are invited to prepare an “ALLELUIA!” at home. This includes Faith members of all ages—including YOU!!

ALLELUIA Banner kits are available for you and/or any member of your household who would like to participate. Pick one up under the lower canopy by the sanctuary door at church. Instructions and all supplies are included (you simply supply crayons, markers, or colored pencils). These may be created at home and **returned during the Drive-in service on Transfiguration Sunday - February 14.** The ALLELUIAs will be tucked away until Easter Sunday, when they return as a joyous cross banner.
